## Writing

We are finishing our friendship paragraphs and the kids have loved getting to know each other better through this unit. They've also been using transition words and experimenting with adjectives to add details and interesting language to their writing. Our next unit will introduce students to the $2^{\text {nd }}$ grade "Seed Journal," which allows them to practice responding to the books they are reading in class. Students
writing prompt each week, such as retelling or giving their opinions on texts they read. These journals will be collected weekly and will require students to build time-management skills and responsibility, while writing. The editing process will continue to be reinforced, with students checking their writing for "C.U.P.S."

## Core

We've wrapped up our unit on the Constitution and the War of 1812. Students enjoyed being delegates and attending a $2^{\text {nd }}$ grade Constitutional Convention. We wrote a constitution for $2^{\text {nd }}$ graders at Bethke and all students signed the document. We will begin to explore immigration and the westward expansion of the United States. We will understand the importance of the railroad, buffalo, and how and why movement occurred as settlers moved West.

Math
Students had so much fun in Topic 2 of Math! They learned how to create arrays to solve repeated addition problems. They used bar diagrams to add parts together to create the "whole" and students were introduced to new vocabulary such as arrays, rows, columns, and bar diagram. Topic 3 is off to a great start! We are now utilizing open number lines as a tool to add using double digits. Students will begin to feel comfortable choosing from many different strategies to add, including open number lines, breaking
apart 2-digit numbers, and adding within 100 using place value strategies. Thank you for continuing to support your child with addition and subtraction facts to 20 . This fact fluency is so beneficial to students as they begin working with larger numbers.
